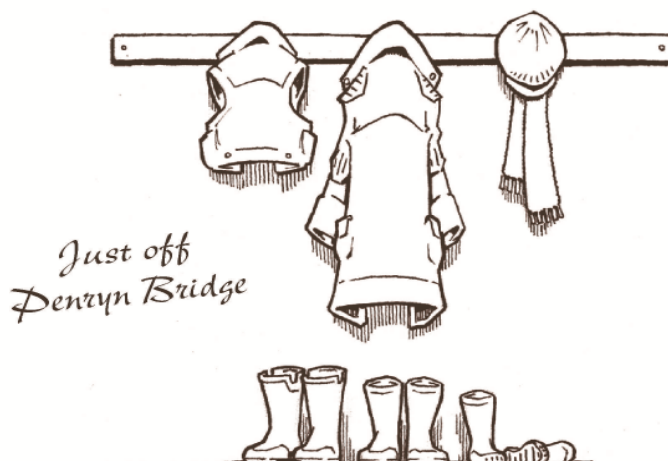

PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council last met on the 26th September, 14 members of the public also attended.



Volunteers are still needed for a community driving scheme and also to form part of a work party for small jobs within the parish. Please let the Clerk know if you are able to contribute to either of these.

There was a letter in last month's Perran News regarding overgrown hedges and kerbsides, the writer asking what the parish council did with the money it received. The situation is that technically, nearly all the paths are the responsibility of Cornwall Council. However the parish council cuts certain footpaths on behalf of CC for which it gets a grant. This grant does not cover all the paths cut, so the parish council also makes up the difference. Roadside overgrowth responsibility rests with Cornwall Council as the Highways authority, the parish council is not allowed to cut these unless it gets specific permission from CC. Some of the overgrowth will be a matter for the individual landowner, the parish council is able to send out notices asking them to get the hedges cut back, but cannot directly enforce this. The details have to be sent on to CC if the work is not done.

Cornwall Council will then complete the work and send the invoice to the landowner. If you have concerns about any overgrowth, please contact

Cornwall Council either by phone or on line at www.cornwall.gov.uk or contact the Ward Member for the Parish, Councillor Peter Williams.

A plea also about refuse collections, the parish council has received complaints that a lot of the contents of the black bags are being strewn around by birds/cats etc. If you have to put your refuse out on the previous night, instead of first thing in the morning, please ensure that the bags are covered securely with a blanket or old piece of carpet.

The next parish council meeting is on Wednesday November 28th 2018 in the Village Hall, at 7.15pm, with public participation between 7.00pm and 7.15pm*. This is the last meeting of the year as the council does not meet in December.

A Typical September

The first half of September was fine with some warm days and little rain. There was an unsettled, windy spell mid-month, with the 20th and 22nd being particularly wet. The last week saw settled autumnal weather under anticyclonic conditions.

The average daily maximum temperature of 18.5C was approximately 1C above the long-term average, making it the warmest September here since 2006. Daily minimum temperatures were near normal.

Rainfall was slightly below average, as were our sunshine hours.

All in all, not a bad month.

UK Climate Trend

A recent article in the Daily Telegraph was headed "Southern England Summers are becoming increasingly hotter than those in other UK regions". Apparently, average summer temperatures in the various UK regions are diverging further and further away from each other, with East Anglia, the South East and central Southern regions now more than 5C warmer than northern Scotland this year. This is the second biggest differential after 1921 in the series since 1910.

The summer temperature differential between the UK's warmest and coolest regions was between 3.8C and 4.2C for virtually every summer up until the 1980s, but since the 1990s the differential has increased to mainly between 4.2C and 4.6C, increasing further up to the present day.

The South West and South Wales region's differential has stayed relatively constant at just under 1C above the UK average summer temperature.

And finally:

Readers may be interested in the fact that the very warm month of June 2018 was only the 18th warmest June in a series going back over 350 years, the warmest of all being back in 1846.

This does make the event especially worthwhile and, with the hardships generated by the current economic situation, demands on the Family Centre are likely, once again, to be greater each Christmas. The response of the people within our Parish throughout the years, to the request for either new, or good second-hand toys that many youngsters have grown out of, has been outstanding, for which we at the combined Anglican-Methodist Church at St.Piran's are extremely grateful.

We are therefore appealing, once again, to any parents or grandparents who have unwanted toys or games (suitable for age ranges from babies to teenagers) in good and workable condition, if they would be so kind as to donate them to this worthwhile event. However, we appreciate that there may be readers who may not be in a position to provide actual toys. With this in mind, we also accept monetary donations for those who would like to make such contributions. To allay any concerns anyone might have about the misuse of the money, this is not given to the families as cash, but is used by the staff of the Family Centre to purchase Christmas Fare and other items to distribute to those who might otherwise have a very sparse or non-existent Christmas Season. All contributions will therefore be gratefully received and sensibly used. Preferably bring your contributions to this Family Service for all ages (young people especially welcome), which is followed by light refreshments

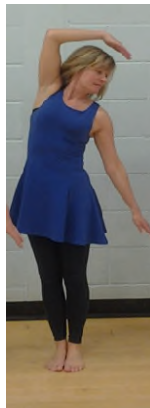

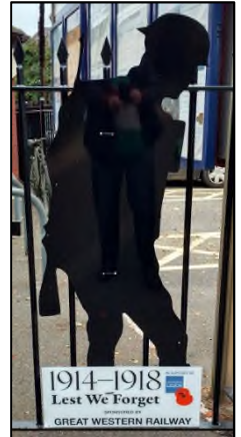
A number of the single-track lanes in the local area are very over grown and it is also apparent the local council are not doing their share. Presumably due to budget cuts.

OUR VILLAGE'S COMMEMORATION OF 100 YEARS SINCE THE ENDING OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR ON 11TH NOVEMBER 2018

Sunday 11th November is of particular significance as it will be 100 years since the First World War ended. There is a national programme of events planned and we are pleased to mark this occasion locally.

Several groups and individuals, in the village, have combined to ensure we commemorate this important centenary appropriately. Those involved include the children from our school, Carnon Downs Drama group, the Knitting, Embroidery and History groups, WI, Royal British Legion, Friends of the Railway Station, the Community Choir and the Church. The shop, pub and garage are also supporting activities currently being planned. Some funding has been provided by the Parish Council and we are all very grateful for the support being given by so many.



Activities planned include an exhibition in the Village Hall for 4 days on either side of 11th November, with photographs, art and craft work, poetry including articles about the 14 men, from our village, who were killed during WW1. We are particularly grateful to Rob and Clare Holmes who have extensively researched the lives of these soldiers and are actively involved in this commemoration to ensure their lives are remembered.

Mini displays are planned in the centre of the village and in the vicinity of the station evoking memories of WW1.

Saturday 10th November 10.00am

Look out for the “ghosts” that will be appearing near the display sites and the pub on Saturday 10th November when the Royal Oak will be hosting a themed coffee morning from 10.00am. Traditional cakes will be on offer from the era. Starting from the pub, a trail will be laid on Saturday/ Sunday to drive or walk and discover more about the 14 soldiers -where they lived and worked in our village.

Sunday 11th November 10.30am

A Royal British Legion service will take place at the War Memorial on Sunday 11th November and we recommend assembling around 10.30am. Children from the school will be placing hand crafted poppies on the War Memorial with the individual names of the 14 soldiers who were killed. A special display of Royal British Legion poppies will form a backdrop to the War Memorial.

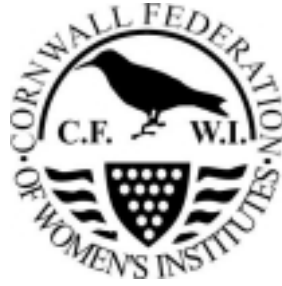
The Remembrance Sunday Service in St Piran's Church will follow on from the gathering at the War Memorial. We would encourage as many people who feel able to attend this service to come along and view the locally made barbed wire wreath which poignantly marks the centenary year. Rosemary Aitken will be reading her poem written specifically to commemorate our 14 soldiers-it is very moving.

Sunday 11th November 2.30pm

In the afternoon, the Village Hall will be the location for a variety of events marking this unique occasion. A programme of poetry, singing and a WWI sketch has been put together by the School, Carnon Downs Drama Group and Community Choir. The events start at 2.30 pm concluding at 4.00pm, when the Parish Church bells will be rung. This is part of a nationwide bell ringing programme to mark the end of the conflict at 4.00pm.

These carpets are transitory, staying only until the wind swirls the morning so I know I must enjoy them while they last"



An extract from "November" - A countrywoman's notes by Rosemary Verey.

Today I made Quince Jelly. This year we had quite a number of the golden yellow, fragrant fruits. CYDONIA "SERBIAN GOLD" once again gave us these. Still a young tree, only ten feet or so high, with as usual, the best fruits on the highest branches.

CYDONIA OBLONGA . "The common quince" is a native of northern Persia and Turkistan and grows into a small tree of up to 18 feet. This and the named varieties make attractive trees grown as single specimens, or as part of an orchard.

This is a good time of the year to plant trees and shrubs. The weather is still mild especially in Cornwall, and the soil is still warm which encourages root growth this side of the New Year. Quinces have several seasons of interest during the year. In winter the dark stems make an interesting tracery against the sky, especially lovely when lit by winter sunshine. In spring the single flowers spangling the branches are of a good size up to two inches across and white, soft pink or deep pink depending on the variety. The new leaves are softly hairy giving a silvery sheen over the green. The fruits are golden yellow, round or pear-shaped, depending on the variety. Whichever variety, the fruits are a real delight in sunshine. Picking October for jelly, jam, or pulp that can be frozen. As a last flourish the leaves turn butter yellow before they fall.

All varieties are self-fertile, which is a distinct advantage for a solitary tree. Quinces like moisture at the roots so a dampish spot is ideal, but they must have sunshine. **CYDONIA "VRANJA"** is an erect growing variety which makes it suitable for fan training on a sunny wall.

Christopher Lloyd writes: " A quince tree loaded with ripe fruits is a wonderful site, as they are luminous yellow and glow in October sunshine."

Another group of trees that are easy to grow in any reasonable soil are MALUS – crab-apples. Fruiting crabs with edible fruits are self-fertile which allows them to be planted singly. They are very useful in the orchard as they flower through April and May attracting bees over a long period, and aiding pollination of the other fruiting trees. Growing to small and medium-sized trees, and wind tolerant they are ideal for our windy county.

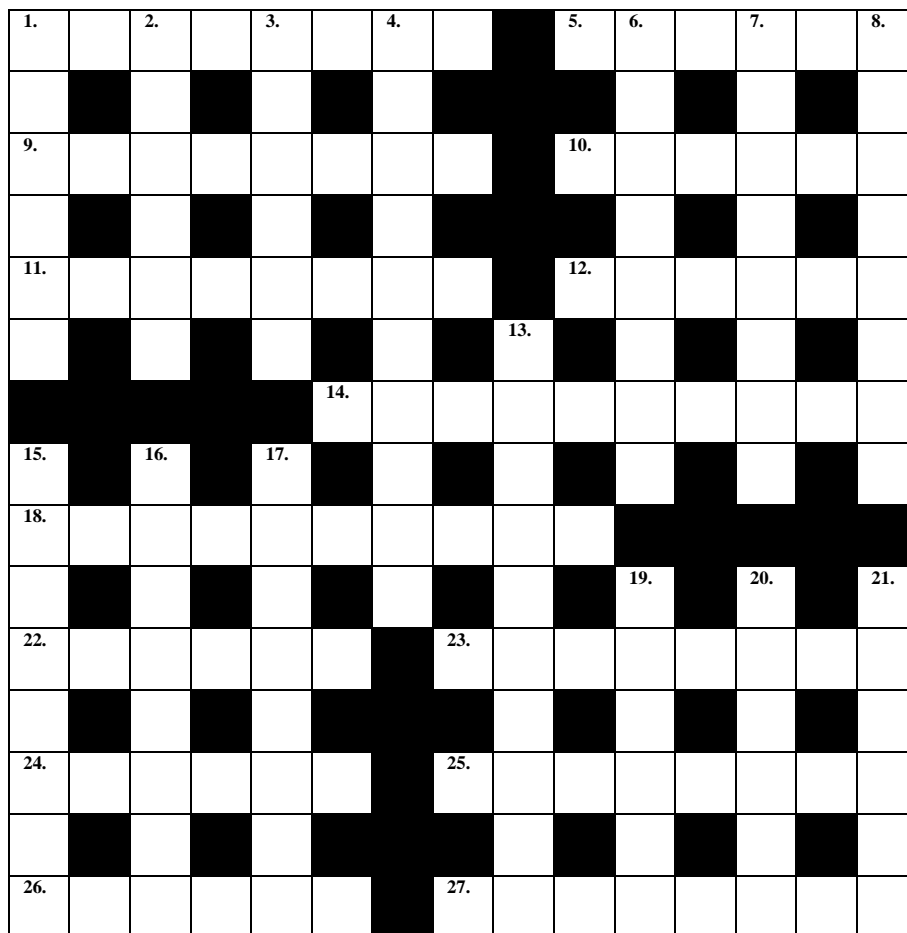
I can recommend **MALUS "JOHN DOWNEY"** - perhaps the best fruiting crab. A hardy tree with white flowers, and in autumn oval fruits of bright and red. The jelly is red, and of a refreshing flavour. It was introduced before 1891 and received an award of Garden Merit in 1969.

Another crab-apple that does well with us is **MALUS "DARTMOUTH"** which was raised before 1883. This is an attractive hybrid producing abundant white flowers, and plentiful round reddish-purple fruits. I made a batch of jelly from the fruits which is darker red and a rich flavour.

Both the quince jelly and crab-apple jab jelly are lovely with cold cuts, and cheese. Not to be missed when served with splits or scones and clotted cream. Remember jelly (jam) first!

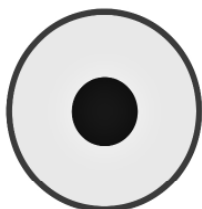

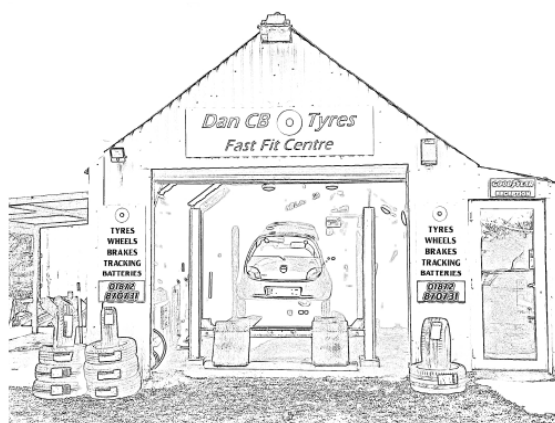

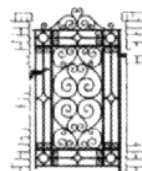
